WHAT IS IT? YSW is the Youth Support Worker

The YSW is located adjacent the School Psychologist, opposite the School Engagement Team



### **Youth Support Worker (YSW)**

The YSW provides advocacy and support for students in need. They also offer programs for targeted groups and for all students. The YSW is NOT responsible for discipline or imposing consequences, however, they do offer support for students not meeting school expectations and students needing skills to manage the demands of school life. The YSW has connections to services external to the school and may access these services to recruit additional support for students.

The YSW's office is adjacent to the School Psychologist, opposite SET and near the E-Hub.

To make a time to speak to the YSW students need to make an approach out of class time. If the YSW is not there you can leave a note under the office door with your name and a request for an appointment.

## ENGAGEMENT TEAM

### **School Psychologist**

The School Psychologist provides support for students experiencing psycho-educational challenges. These challenges include but are not limited to learning difficulties, low mood, anxiety, family or relationships breakdown, trauma and health disorders. Confidentiality is key in the psychologist's work with students. Where appropriate the psychologist will run up to four private sessions with a student. When there is a need for ongoing support an offer of help to access an external service will be made. The School Psychologist's office is adjacent to the YSW, opposite SET and near the E-Hub.

To make a time to speak to the psychologist students need to make an approach out of class time. If the psychologist is not answering the door you can fill in a self-referral form available in a container attached to the door.
